As COVID-19 restrictions started to relax in 2022, the Cade Foundation continued to find ways to bridge the social disconnect caused by the pandemic in order to **make some of our events more accessible**. We made this possible by hosting some of our events, such as our Pathways to Parenthood conferences and our annual Race for the Family, virtually and over several sessions throughout the year. Doing this made it **easier for more people to participate in learning/spreading awareness** about infertility and family-building strategies, as well as **raising money** for families battling infertility, and **we were able to see yet another successful year of programming**.

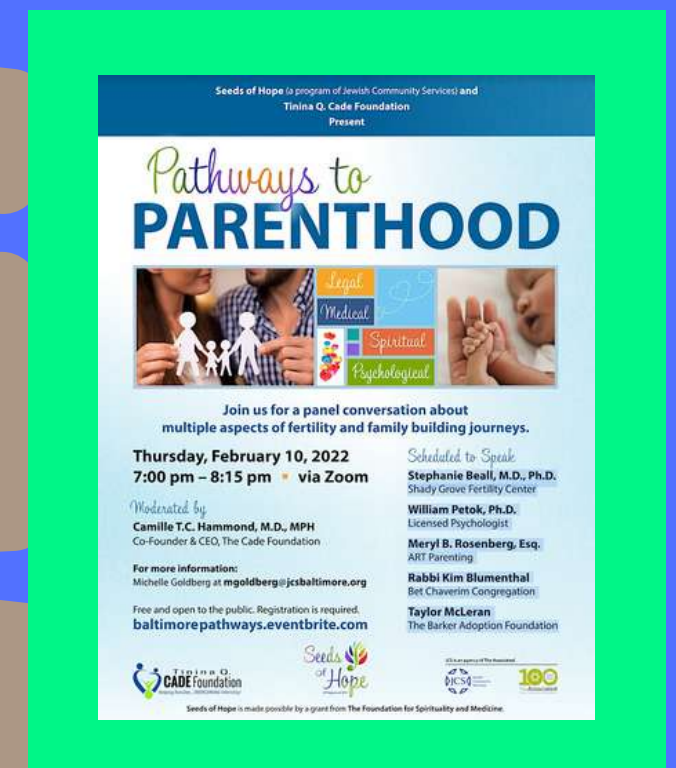

Pathways to Parenthood

- Our Pathways to Parenthood conferences were a **series of informal discussions** that provided information to families about **different ways to become parents** following a diagnosis of infertility.
- Each conference had a **panel of speakers** (including a variety of **experts** such as fertility specialists, adoption experts, foster care experts, acupuncturists, mental health providers, legal experts, and surrogacy experts).
- Before and after the panel, there were opportunities for informal connecting and **community building**.
- Due to COVID-19, all conferences in 2022 were held virtually on Zoom.

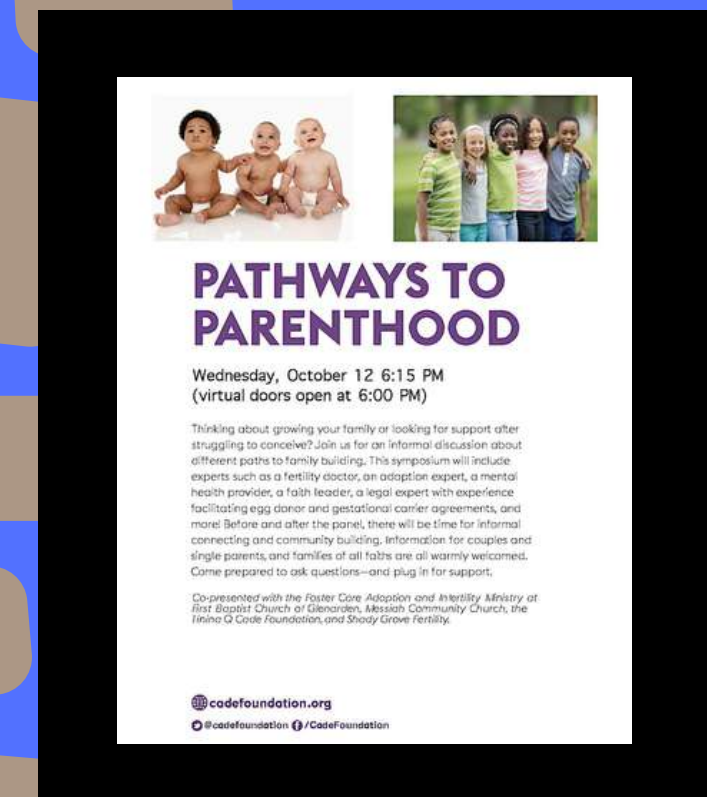

Corks with Cade

- Corks with Cade was a **series of fundraisers** that was sure to bring a lot of **wine and fun** for all attendees.
- In 2022, these events were held in **three different locations** (New York, Maryland, and California), each supplemented with **wine-tastings, gourmet food, and their own variety of fun activities.**
- Proceeds from each event **supported our Family Building Grants**, which was provided to families with infertility pursuing fertility treatments and adoption.

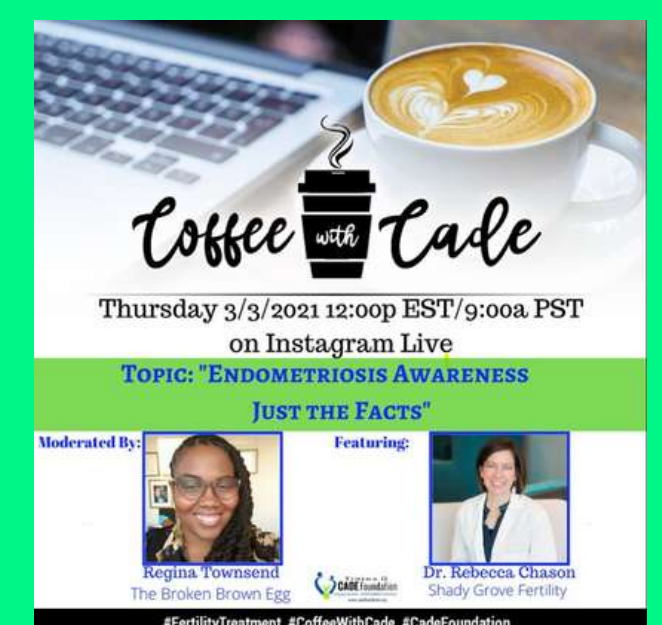

- Coffee with Cade was our **Instagram Live interview series** that discussed **various fertility and family-related topics** with **guest experts**.
- Topics ranged from family-building to social justice in fertility to endometriosis awareness.



Race for the Family + Fertilifest

- Race for the Family was our 5k run/walk that **celebrated all pathways to parenthood**, as well as the **strength and courage** it takes to **overcome infertility**.
- People were asked to move either 5k (3.2 miles) or 1 mile and to share how, where, and how long it took to complete the race.
- FertiFest was our **family building festival** that **connected people to local resources and vendors** who support families with infertility.



- Proceeds from the race **supported our Family Building Grants**, which was provided to families with infertility pursuing fertility treatments and adoption.
- Due to COVID-19, Race for the Family was held **virtually on two dates**. People had the option of walking/running along with the community or alone/with a small group.
- FertiFest was held in-person on the October 8th race date.



Reproductive Justice Summit

- Our Reproductive Justice Summit focused on **sharing information about health disparities and local resources to improve access to and delivery** of reproductive healthcare services to black, brown, and other **marginalized women** in urban areas.
- This summit aimed to **provide opportunities for healthcare providers, community leaders, and social media influencers to network and to brief them about the topics to learn and advocate** about in order to improve access to information and services through improved legislation.

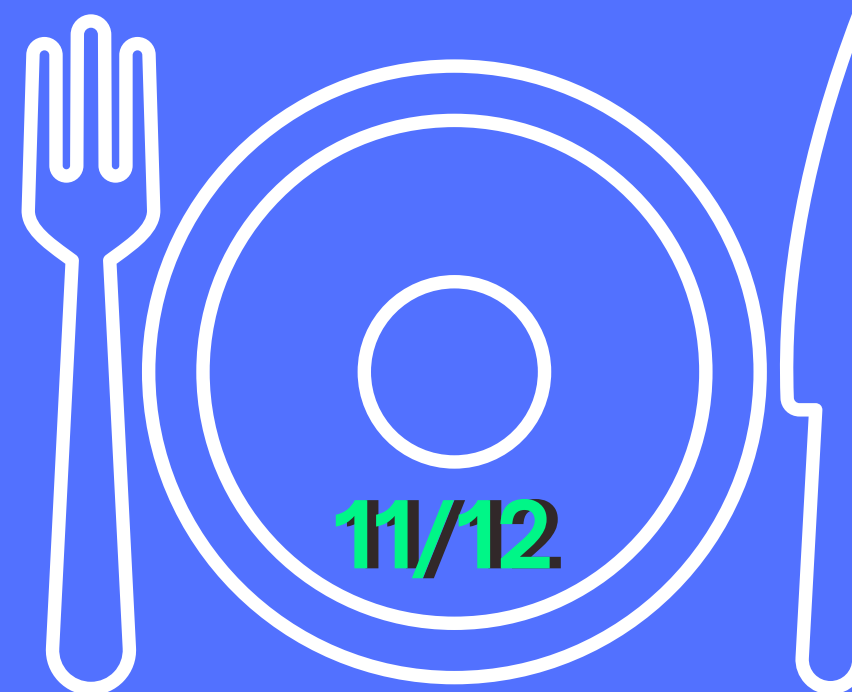

Le Diner Bleu

- Le Diner Bleu is our **annual luxe black tie gala** that **celebrates families overcoming infertility**.
- The event included **dinner, dancing, entertainment, a silent auction, and a seated program**.
- Attendees were asked to include a “splash” of Bleu in their attire.



Grant Overview

- An average of over **200 grant applications** are received annually for the Cade Foundation Summer and Fall Applications. These are all then carefully reviewed by over **40 qualified professionals** during the **grant review process**.

Family Building Grant

The Family Building Grant is an annual award that provides up to **\$10,000 to needy, infertile families**. These grants assist with the costs associated with infertility treatment or domestic adoption. A **fertility medication grant** is provided through a generous donation from **EMD Serono**.

Stephen Greenhouse Grant

The Stephen Greenhouse Grant, specifically **designated for a Shady Grove Fertility (SGF) patient**, is held to **honor the memory and legacy of Dr. Stephen Greenhouse**, a SGF physician and leader who died in an accident in July of 2018.

Savannah Grant

The Savannah Grant is a family building grant which provides support **specifically to SGF patients pursuing parenthood through the use of IVF**. This grant is in **honor of Savannah Caroline Pereira**, a SGF baby who tragically died in March 2010.

Funds Raised + Grant Breakdown

NY Corks with Cade = **\$30,445.12**

17 families received grants in 2022

MD Corks with Cade = **\$9,820.31**

\$10,405 in Family Building Grants

CA Corks with Cade = **\$23,000**

\$10,000 in Stephen Greenhouse Grants

Race for the Family = **\$40,770.50**

\$10,000 in Savannah Grants

Le Diner Bleu = **\$38,688.30**

\$5,000 in Fertility Medicine Grants

TOTAL = \$142,724.30 raised

\$44,094 in TOTAL grants

- The Interns also each completed and presented their own **capstone projects** about infertility and select reproductive and maternal health issues.

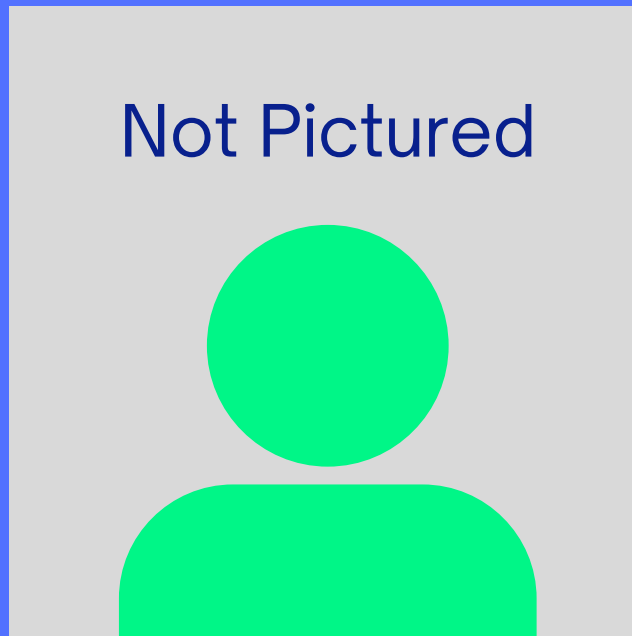

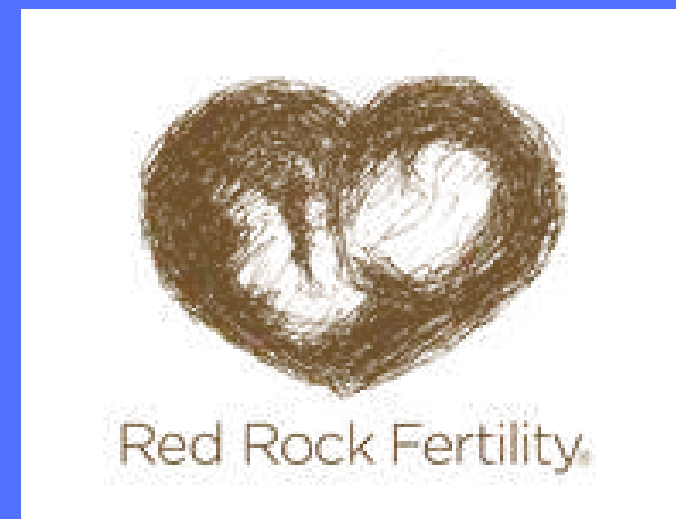
